


Note 1 - Description of Plan and Significant Accounting Policies

The following description of the New York City District Council of Carpenters Annuity Fund (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan first became effective July 1, 1966 and is a defined contribution profit sharing plan established under an Agreement and Declaration of Trust pursuant to collective bargaining agreements between the District Council of New York City and Vicinity of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America (the "District Council") and various employers and employer associations in the construction industry in the New York Metropolitan Area. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Management has evaluated subsequent events through the date of the auditor's report, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Purpose

The purpose of the Plan is to provide retirement benefits to eligible participants.

Participation

An individual becomes a participant in the Plan upon completion of one hour of service in covered employment for a contributing employer.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in all contributions and related earnings credited to their individual accounts.

Note 1 - Description of Plan and Significant Accounting Policies (cont'd)

Benefits

A participant, or the participant's beneficiary, is entitled to receive benefits, if the participant:

1. Attains age 55 and retires
2. Dies
3. Becomes disabled
4. Has participated in the Plan for at least 60 consecutive months. Maximum amount of withdrawal is the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their individual account. This once-in-a-lifetime withdrawal may be received for any reason
5. Has attained at least 59 1/2 years of age, established their account before July 1, 1992, and is still working for a contributing employer
6. Has no employers' contributions credited to their individual account for four consecutive months
7. Has a child. A participant can receive in-service distributions of up to \$5,000 per child within one year of birth or adoption, with the option to repay the distribution within three years from the date of the distribution.

Plan regulations mandate that the distribution of a participant's benefit commences when the participant attains age 73.

Effective December 3, 2025, a participant may elect to receive a Qualified Disaster Recovery Distribution ("QDRD") upon satisfying certain conditions in accordance with the Plan and will not exceed the lesser of \$22,000 or 100% of their individual account.

Benefits are recorded when paid.

A participant may elect any one of the following methods of payment:

- a. Periodic payments of substantially equal amounts for a specified fixed period
- b. One/partial lump sum
- c. Single life annuity or a qualified joint survivor annuity (for accounts established before July 1, 1995)
- d. Any combination of the items listed in (a) and (b) above

In accordance with IRS Regulations, minimal account balances may be distributed in one lump sum payment without consent of the participant.

Participant accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each participant of the Plan and are "participant directed" for investment purposes. Under this approach, each participant directs the investment of their account into various investment options offered by the Plan. Each participant's account is credited with contributions made on their behalf. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Hardship withdrawals

In the event of certain financial hardships, as defined in the Plan, a participant may apply for a distribution from their account upon satisfying certain conditions.

Plan termination

The Trustees expect and intend to continue the Plan indefinitely, but reserve the right to amend or terminate it as provided for by the applicable Trust Agreement and Plan provisions. If the Plan is terminated, the rights of all affected participants and beneficiaries, to the value of the amounts credited to participants' accounts, shall be non-forfeitable and the Plan assets will be allocated to pay all obligations of the Plan and to provide benefits to those eligible under the terms of the Plan and as otherwise required by law.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are presented on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. See "Fair value measurements" footnote for additional information.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Employers' contributions receivable

Employers' contributions receivable is estimated based on receipts in the subsequent plan year that pertain to prior plan years.

The Plan, in its normal course of business, performs audits of the records of contributing employers to monitor compliance with their obligation to make contributions to the Plan. It is the Plan's policy that any employer contributions due to the Plan based on these procedures are recorded as income in the period in which such amounts are received.

Notes receivable from participants

A participant may generally borrow up to 50% of the amount in their individual account not to exceed \$50,000 less the highest outstanding balance of their total Plan loans during the last 12 months. The loans are secured by the balance in the participants' accounts. Loans are limited to purposes defined in the Plan and bear interest using the same criteria as commercial lending institutions. In general, loans must be repaid quarterly over a period of five years. Loans relating to the purchase of a principal residence must be repaid over a period of 10 years.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. As of June 30, 2025 and 2024 no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments in accordance with the terms of the loan and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

Participants who default on a loan are not eligible to apply for another loan for a period of five years.

Lease

The Plan assesses whether a contractual arrangement qualifies as a lease at inception and only reassesses its determination if the terms and conditions of the arrangement are modified. If an arrangement qualifies as a lease, the Plan evaluates whether it should be classified as an operating or financing lease.

Lease (cont'd)

For leases assessed as long-term, lease right-of-use assets represent the Plan's right to use the underlying asset for the lease term and lease liabilities represent the Plan's obligation to make lease payments arising from the leases. The Plan records a lease liability based on the future estimated cash payments discounted over the non-cancellable portion of the lease term. In the event an implicit discount rate is not readily determined in lease agreements, the Plan uses the risk-free Treasury rate at the lease commencement date in determining the present value of future lease payments. Lease right-of-use assets may include lease payments made and exclude lease incentives. Lease terms may include options to extend or terminate the lease when it is reasonably certain that the Plan will exercise that option. Lease expense for lease payments is recognized on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

Administrative expense allocation

The administrative office is occupied by the Plan and various related organizations. Certain expenses not specifically applicable to a particular entity are allocated based on the estimated benefit received by each entity. Amounts reported as receivable from related organizations or payable to related organizations generally include balances for shared expenses.

Reimbursements paid to related organizations for the years ended June 30, 2025 and 2024 were \$3,596,673 and \$3,589,886, respectively.

The Plan leases office space from the New York City District Council of Carpenters Pension Fund (the "Pension Fund"), a related organization. Rent and related costs are included in the total occupancy expense of the Plan.

Note 2 - Fair value measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices, in active markets, for identical assets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets in inactive markets, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset, and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset.

Note 2 - Fair value measurements (cont'd)

Level 3 inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. Level 3 inputs are generally based on the best information available, which may include the reporting entity's own assumptions and data.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Registered investment companies: Valued at the closing price reported in the active market in which the securities are traded.

Investments measured at net asset value: Common/collective trust funds and pooled separate accounts are estimated by the management of the investment entities.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Certain investments that are measured at fair value using the net asset value per share (or its equivalent) practical expedient have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts presented in the tables below are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the amounts presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 3 - Pooled separate accounts

The Plan invests in pooled separate accounts organized by Empower Annuity Insurance Company ("Empower"), formerly Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Co ("Prudential"), and made available to participants as investment options for qualified retirement plans. The primary underlying investment of each pooled separate account is the mutual fund of the same name. Investments in shares of the underlying mutual fund are valued at the net asset value as reported by the underlying mutual fund, which may be obtained from pricing services or other pricing sources. All risks associated with the eligible underlying mutual funds apply to each pooled separate account. Investment income from underlying funds represents the proportionate share of net investment income which includes but is not limited to, dividend and interest income. The estimated fair value of the Plan's investment as of June 30, 2025 and 2024 was \$1,949,168,042 and \$1,785,254,762, respectively.

Note 4 - Unallocated contract

The Plan is party to a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company ("Empower"), formerly Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Co ("Prudential"). This traditional investment contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract value of the unallocated contract as of June 30, 2025 and 2024 was \$1,586,391,496 and \$1,591,097,363, respectively. The crediting interest rate is reviewed and reset on a semi-annual basis and in no instance will fall below 0.00%.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with the fully benefit-responsive investment contract is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. Certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

There are not any events that allow the issuer to terminate the contract and which require the Board of Trustees to settle at an amount different than contract value paid either within 90 days or over time. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers, which would also limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

Note 5 - Party-in-interest transactions

Certain Plan investments are held by the manager of the investment; therefore, transactions relating to those investments qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions and are identified as such on the supplemental schedules of investments. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions and are identified as such on the supplemental schedules.

Note 6 - Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Note 7 - Employers' contributions

In accordance with collective bargaining agreements and participation agreements, employers are required to make contributions to the Plan on behalf of employees performing covered work. Employer contributions are generally based on an hourly rate or percentage of salary.

Note 9 - Tax status

The Plan has received a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated October 1, 2015, stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) and is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Trustees believe that the Plan, including amendments subsequent to the IRS determination, is currently designed and operated in compliance with the requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, they believe that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax exempt as of the financial statement date. Additionally, the Plan believes it has no uncertain tax positions as of June 30, 2025 and 2024 in accordance with FASB ASC Topic 740 "Income Taxes".

Note 10 - Reconciliation of financial statements to Form 5500

For financial statement purposes, participant loans are required to be classified as notes receivable from participants. This differs from the reporting requirements of the Department of Labor which requires that these assets be shown as investments.

For financial statement purposes, investment expenses are reported as a reduction of investment income. The reporting requirements of the Department of Labor require these fees be shown as administrative expenses.
