SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORT

FOR NEW YORK DISTRICT COUNCIL OF CARPENTERS ANNUITY FUND

This is a summary of the annual report for New York District Council of Carpenters Annuity Fund, EIN 51-0174279, Plan No. 001, for period July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Basic Financial Statement

Benefits under the plan are provided by insurance and a trust fund. Plan expenses were \$187,417,685. These expenses included \$3,680,110 in administrative expenses, \$173,431,800 in benefits paid to participants and beneficiaries, and \$10,305,775 in other expenses. A total of 38,636 persons were participants in or beneficiaries of the plan at the end of the plan year, although not all of these persons had yet earned the right to receive benefits.

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan, was \$3,246,369,022 as of June 30, 2023, compared to \$3,002,098,885 as of July 1, 2022. During the plan year the plan experienced an increase in its net assets of \$244,270,137. This increase includes unrealized appreciation and depreciation in the value of plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. The plan had total income of \$431,687,822, including employer contributions of \$161,048,110, employee contributions of \$483,160, rollovers of \$1,720,639, earnings from investments of \$263,226,860, and other income of \$5,209,053.
